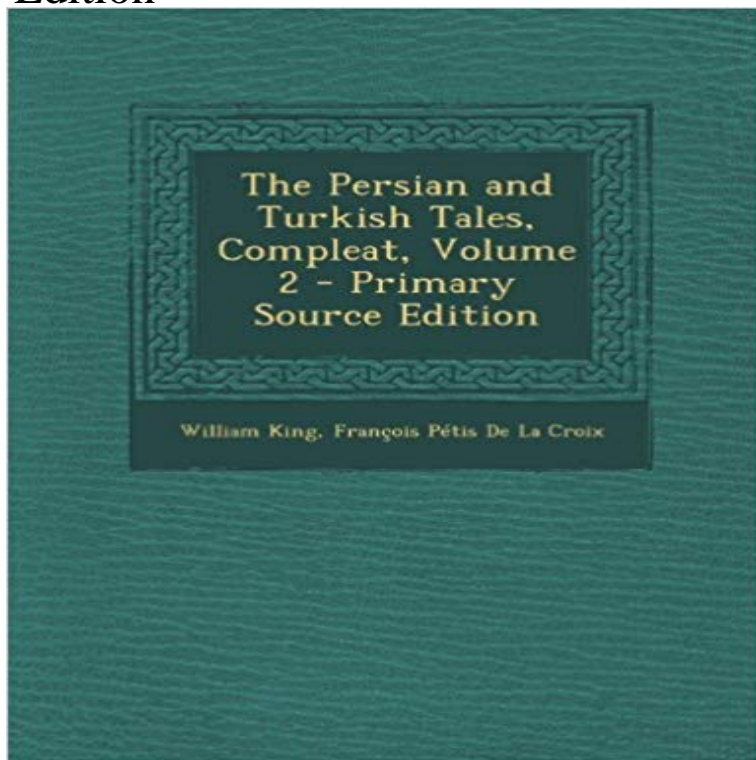


The Persian and Turkish Tales, Compleat, Volume 2 - Primary Source Edition
