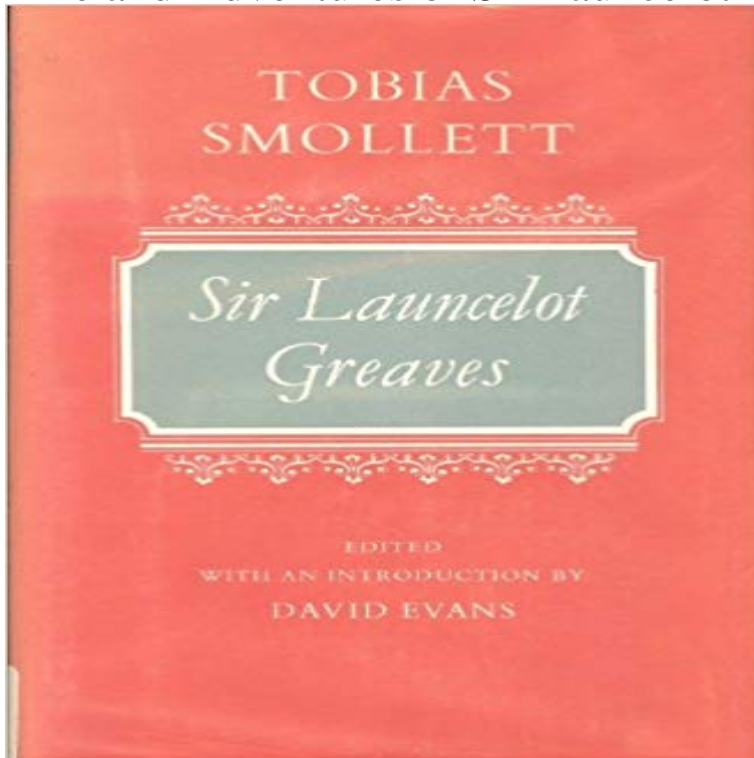


## Life and Adventures of Sir Launcelot Greaves (Oxford English Novels)
