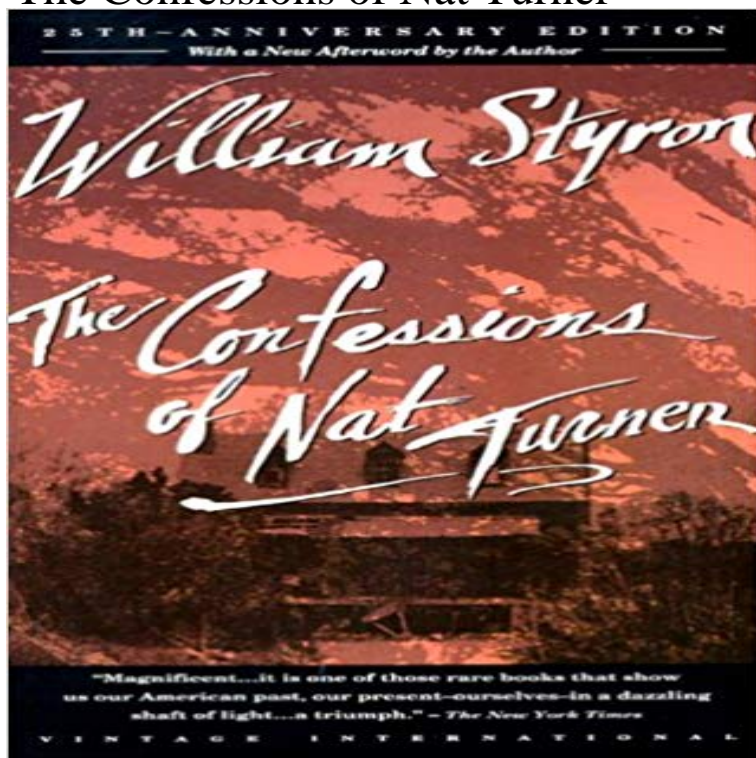


## The Confessions of Nat Turner
