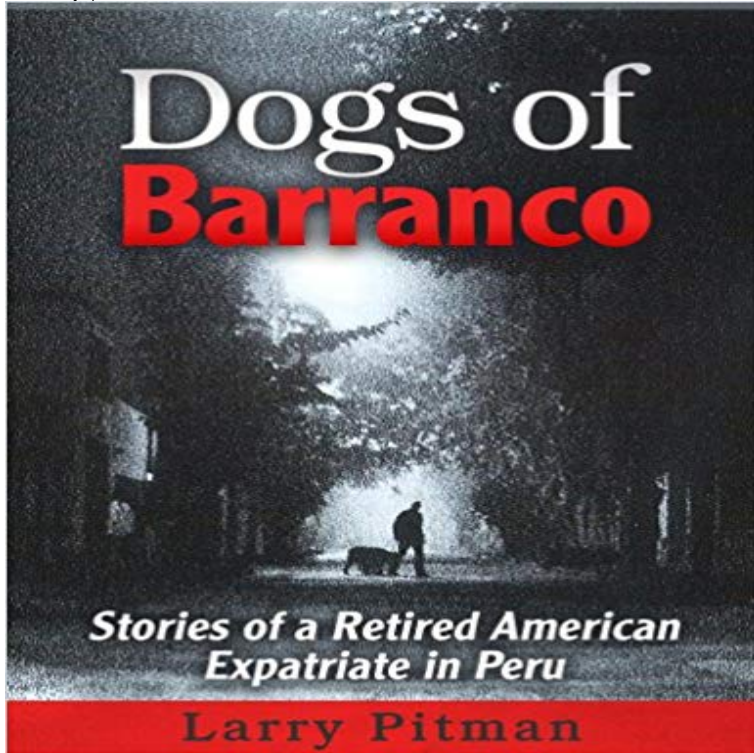


Dogs of Barranco: Stories of a Retired American Expatriate in Peru
